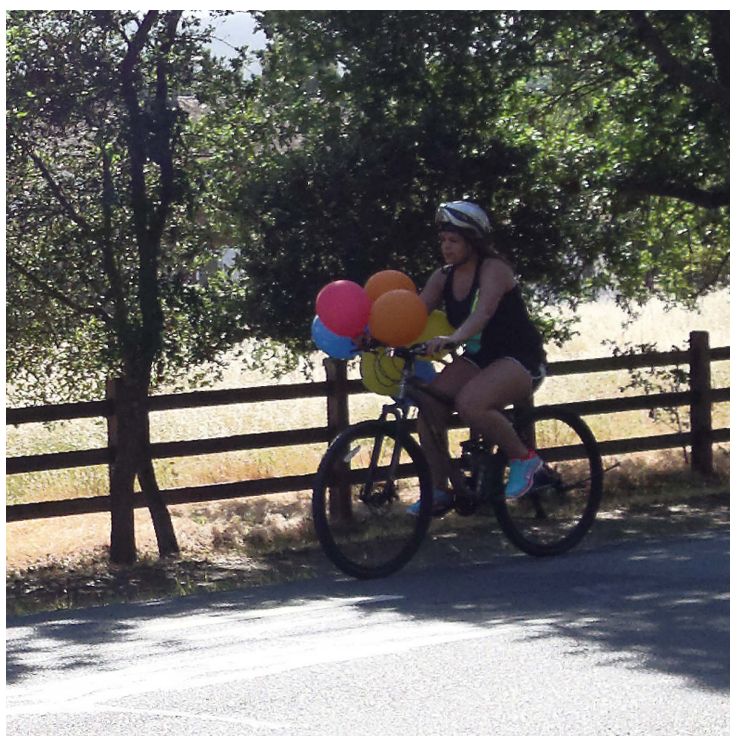


Is it windier than normal?

From home, it's only 62 miles, which should go by pretty easily. Ironically, I think it was the frequent stops to take photos along the way that made it tougher.

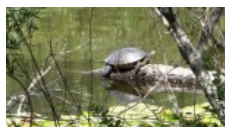


Don't know what's with the balloons, but might be a backward helmet too
